Headteacher's Notices

This has been another excellent week in school, with children across all Teams continuing to demonstrate and evidence outstanding progress in their learning. In particularly, I continue to be impressed by the children's positive attitudes to learning and their willingness to meet new challenges head on to achieve their targets.

On my visit to Team Walliams this week, the engagement of the children and the high standards of handwriting and presentation of work was outstanding! The children all showed very clearly that they are enjoying their time in Team Walliams, are hungry for new knowledge and keen to develop new skills.

Across school, whether it be fact files on Polar Bears linked to the Team Dahl text, 'Leaf', or independent full sentence writing by our Reception children in Team Donaldson, everyone should be proud of their efforts in school this week.

Start of the School Day

Thank you to parents/ carers for their ongoing support with punctuality at the start of the school day. Children across all Teams are now in school faster and getting on with their learning far quicker than previously. A reminder for parents/ carers that the school day begins at 8:45am. Teachers are now ringing the bell at 8:40am, rather than 8:45am. This does not mean school starts at 8:40am. This is so that teachers and support staff can be out on the yard at 8:40am to welcome the children in their Teams, get the children settled and lined up, ready to enter school at 8:45am. Children should be on the yard, ready for the start of the school day no later than 8:40am. This enables them to be lined up, ready to enter school and be focused on their learning.

Remembrance Day Assembly

Both children and staff participated in a special assembly this morning to mark Armistice Day and to observe the two-minute silence at 11:00am. Children learned about the Armistice, which was signed in November 1918 and came into effect at 11:00am to mark the end of The First World War. Thank you to Luke and Jessica (Year 6) for their excellent recital of two of the most well know 'war poems' - 'Flanders Fields' and 'Ode to Remembrance' from 'For the Fallen'.

Autumn Term Teacher/ Parent Consultations

Thank you to the many, many parents/ carers who have already booked appointments to speak with their child's class teacher as part of school's Autumn Term Teacher/ Parent Consultations.

To continue to provide parents/ carers with a choice between face-to-face and telephone appointments, bookings are being taken for two separate days. Feedback from many parents/ carers remains that having a choice of telephone appointments provides support with work commitments and in not having to seek time off work to attend the appointment in person at school.

I continue to request that parents/ carers use the suggested one way system around school. This is the best way to manage the large volume of traffic around school and ensure the safety of the children. I have attached the map showing the suggested route to this newsletter.
