Sports Leadership Programme

This programme develops key leadership skills, and knowledge of planning and delivering a range of sports games, so that children can confidently lead games during break and lunchtime.

History Outreach Programme—Durham University

On Monday, representatives from Durham University History department will be visiting school to deliver a full day of exciting and educational sessions to children in Team Walliams and Team Morpurgo.

These 'outreach' sessions provide an important part of the school's wider strategy for curriculum provision and delivery, and enable pupils to engage with subject experts and a range of specialist resources to compliment and enhance learning from class. The sessions on Monday will focus on each Team's current History unit for Spring term—Ancient Greece.

Attendance and Punctuality (reminder)



Children who have attendance below 90% are classed as 'persistently absent' and school will make contact with parents/ carers of these children to offer support and to explore any underlying issues, which may be causing poor school attendance. Good school attendance is closely linked to good academic outcomes, with children who have attendance above 95% being far more likely to achieve age-related outcomes and enjoy a positive school experience.

A reminder also that teaching begins at 8:45am each morning, with children being collected from the yard from 8:40am so that they are ready to learn in class with their friends at the start of the school day. There are many important aspects of learning which take place across all Teams from 8:45am, and simply being 10 minutes late each day can have a significant impact of a child's progress through them missing key teaching input or support programmes. Being 10 minutes late each day results in a child missing almost one full week of school each academic year!

Online Safety Guide on how to set up Parental Controls for Android Apps

Most smartphones allow parents and carers to choose which apps and features appear on their child's device and which ones don't – also preventing young people from buying and downloading anything that's unsuitable for their age. Our guide (below) to parental controls for managing apps on Androids will help you to reduce the chance of your child using a game or app that might not be appropriate for their age.

In the guide, you'll find tips on a number of tips such as how to block app downloads, how to stop auto-updates and how to restrict apps.
















On Android phones, restricting access to particular apps usually requires going onto Google Play. From there, it's fairly easy to navigate your way through the settings to manage the parental controls and authentications relating to any apps on the device. These features can prevent your child from downloading or buying anything unsuitable for their age. Updated versions of apps or games that your child has already installed may occasionally contain something inappropriate, so we've explained how to stop those, too.
