- 'Safe, friendly environment, my son has learned so much and is very happy at school.'
- 'Children are treated as individuals. Kids are encouraged to speak up and be creative.'
- 'I think all the staff are just amazing, my child has always felt welcomed from day one and so have we as parents attending school events.'
- 'The school provides an inclusive space for all pupils that recognises difference and actively seeks inclusion. It's a wonderful school and really provides a supportive environment for all. The staff provide great opportunities to students and go above and beyond to educate and provide positive outcomes for all.'

Some suggestions for how school might improve on its current provision:

Although we won't always be able to deliver on your suggestions, we value your thoughts and ideas and where possible will do our best to accommodate these.

'Could be an option to bring in various sports teachers/coaches for PE lessons to give the children the opportunity to try new things during the school day ie. Dance, tennis, fencing etc. I know they have yoga currently.' We have had a wide sporting activities and festivals throughout the year provided by sports coaches such as a Superhero Multiskills festival, handball, curling and boccia, athletics, dance festival, tennis festival, tri-golf, football, ultimate frisbee, balancibility etc. We will continue to look for and provide a variety of sporting activities and different opportunities for the children.

'Teach the children and parents more road safety as they run and walk all over the road when leaving and arriving at school even when cars are coming. Most don't use the path provided.' **This is something** we can certainly raise the profile of in school via whole school assemblies and road safety information can be shared with parents.

'More communication about what our children are learning about term by term in all classes. This is well communicated in some teams but not others. Bit of inconsistency.' We will ensure that this is shared by all Teams in the new academic year and will add any new curriculum maps to the school website.'

'Developing a choir would be nice.' This was already in the plan for next year and Mrs Norris will be starting a choir in the autumn term.
