The Green Cross Code



Find a safer place to cross and then **STOP**. Stand still at the end of the pavement, not too close to the kerb!



LOOK RIGHT, Look left, Look Right again. Look all around. If traffic is coming, let it pass.



LISTEN carefully for cars, bikes or buses. Remember you can't hear electric cars or bikes!



THINK - Is it safe to cross? Walk straight across the road and keep looking and listening for traffic while you cross



Road Safety and Pedestrian Training

On January 12th, Amy Smith from Durham County Council came in to deliver a whole-school road safety assembly. Children learnt the Green Cross Code, the safe way to cross the road and how to do this in different conditions.
